

Ceremonial Trituration of the Bald Eagle

On the Shuswap Reserve in Kamloops, BC in February 2010



Old stories have it that a long time ago humans were able to talk to the animals. They both spoke the same language.

Did you know that this is still true today? It is. The one language we all speak and understand is the language of the soul. I invite you to communicate with the Eagle using the limitless language of the soul.

White people in Europe and North America hunted the Eagle down almost to extinction; the Native people however have always respected it highly. In their tradition the Eagle represents the connection of humans to the Creator. In doing this workshop on an Indian Reserve we follow the Native ways of respecting nature and we will honour their tradition.

On a Shuswap Band in Kamloops we will meet at a wonderful place overlooking the South Thompson River. A mile upstream there is an Eagle's nest. Grinding down (trituration) a small piece of a feather of a Bald Eagle with mortar and pestle, we will set free its energy. We will resonate with the vibration of its energy initially on the lower levels of the physical and emotional, slowly raising the vibration until we reach the spiritual level. Each participant will have his very unique experience and communication with the Eagle. We will get an authentic understanding of the Eagle's message for our personal lives. Neil Leonard, our host, a member of the Kamloops Indian Band, and a keeper of a sweat lodge, has kindly agreed to run a Sweat Lodge Ceremony on Sunday evening for us. Giving thanks to the Eagle Spirit in the sweat lodge will complete our weekend in a sacred way.

Date and Time:

Friday, February 19th, 7.00 pm Introduction into the Ceremonial Trituration.

Saturday, 20th, 9.30 am until around 5 pm: Trituration

Sunday, 21st, 9.30 am until around 4 pm: Completion of the Trituration
around 5.30 pm Sweat Lodge Ceremony.



Location: 670 East Shuswap Road, Kamloops, BC.

Fee: \$ 350. If finances are an issue for you, then anywhere between \$150 and \$350 is fair.

Directions: From Hwy 1 West take exit 374 and go North on Hwy 5 (Yellowhead Hwy), where the sign says towards Jasper. You cross the South Thomson River and turn right (east) at the first set of lights onto East Shuswap Rd. Follow the road for 2 ½ km until in a slight left curve you see on the left side of the road a sign #670 – Neil Leonard. There will be a red ribbon tied to it so you can spot it easily.
